


# Nightingale Infant and Nursery School Weekly Newsletter 29.04.22

### Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

**EYFS** 



In EYFS this week we have started our new topic 'Down on the Farm'. We have read the story 'What the Ladybird Heard' with the children and discussed the different animals found on a farm. We have been singing songs such as Old MacDonald and exploring the animals, equipment and buildings found on a farm through our play. We have used various craft materials to make our own ladybirds, the children particularly enjoyed ladybird potato printing! Outside the children have had the opportunity to paint their own pebble ladybirds and build ladybird hotels using natural materials. In Kingfisher class the children have also been focusing on numbers 11-20 by finding missing teen numbers and using numicon to partition and build 2 digit numbers. The Kingfishers have also learnt two new digraphs this week: 'ear '(pronounced as it is spelled as in year, tear, beard) and 'ure' (pronounced 'your' as in pure, cure, mixture). In Nuthatch the children have been counting, matching and adding spots on a ladybird. As part of our topic we would love to grow some of our own fruits, vegetables and flowers. # Key Stage 1

In key stage one we have started our new topic for this half term based on the book 'The Secret Sky Graden' by Linda Sarah and Fiona Lumbers. We have identified an outside area of the school we are going to improve. We designed our own garden and thought about what we would need in it e.g. flowers, bench, water feature, bug hotel, bird bath, bird feeders. The Friends have kindly provided us with flower seeds which we have been busy planting in pots and talking about what they will need to grow.



In maths this week we have been learning about time. We started by looking at o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. We then moved on to telling the time in five minute intervals and investigating some word problems. ## Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key : White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 3rd September, 4th January, 19 April and 25 July. Please note as it is intended to change the maximum teacher days (189 days) for this academic year only, each school will need to select one additional day to close, in lieu of the extra bank holiday on 3 June 2022; we suggest 5 Jan or 20 April.

Please note the date in yellow **20.4.21** is an additional day off for the Queens Jubilee. This is to be taken by schools as an additional day off. This was discussed with the cluster schools. It was decided with the majority of the cluster that 20.4.21 would be the day taken.
