
Did we win??? No but we had such well-behaved children. The staff were so proud of the children.

Pastoral Support


If you have any concerns about your child's wellbeing and wish to discuss, our Pastoral Support Assistant, Mrs. Lake is here to help.

Learning taking place in our classes this week!



In EYFS this week we have read a new story called 'Farmer Duck'. The children shared their opinions about the farmer and the duck and decided which character they liked the best and why. We thought about all the jobs Farmer Duck had to do around the farm and some of us had a go at writing captions to go with pictures from the story. We looked at what sort of equipment farmers used to use in the past and compared them with today's farming equipment. It was very interesting looking at old black and white photographs. In our outdoor area the children had the opportunity to build their own tractors using loose parts and have a go at milking our pretend cows in the dairy farm! In Art the children have been looking at farm paintings by Vincent Van Gogh discussing what they could see/hear/feel/smell if they were to step inside one of the paintings. Some children had a go at creating their own farm paintings in the style of Van Gogh using similar colours. In Phonics the Kingfishers have been practicing reading and writing words containing 4 or 5 sounds through the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. They had a go at writing their own zigzag books this week using words like 'munch, grunt, scratch'. In maths the children have been using different methods to double numbers to 10 such as rolling dice, counting fingers and drawing ladybird spots. In Nuthatch the children have been learning two new sounds: i and p. They have also been practising one-to-one correspondence when counting objects to 5 or 10. The children are all very excited to see the seeds in their garden growing so brilliantly! Another fabulous week, well done EYFS!




In key stage one this week we have continued with our book 'The Secret Sky Garden'. We learnt about what happens when you go to an airport on holiday. We thought about where we would like to go on holiday and what we would need to take. Some of us wrote a list of items to take and some of us wrote sentences with adjectives and because in e.g. I am taking a pretty hat and a big bottle of sun cream because it is hot in Turkey.

In maths this week we have continued reading scales using thermometers. It was important to look carefully to see if the scale was going up in ones, twos, fives or tens.
