

Nightingale Infant and Nursery School Weekly Newsletter 27.05.2022


Dear Parents/Carers,

Learning taking place in our classes this week!





In EYFS this week the children have been celebrating the Queens Platinum Jubilee! We have read 'What the Ladybird Heard on Holiday' where the Ladybird visits the Queen and a very funny book called 'The Queens Knickers'. This week the children have all had the chance to write a letter to the Queen, write Jubilee party invitations, make a special crown, paint the union flag and make a Queens' guard using split pins. We have also made portraits of the Queen and special jubilee bunting to decorate our classrooms. We have also learnt about the Royal family and Buckingham palace. The children really enjoyed eating their special Jubilee lunch and joining in with the whole school Jubilee concert. In Kingfisher class all children have written their own farm fact book about their favourite farm animals. In maths the children have been adding through mathematical stories using 'first, then, now' and counting on from a number to find the answer. In Nuthatch the children have been learning a new sound, 'n'. Can you find anything at home that begins with the 'n' sound? In maths the Nuthatch children have sorted coins by colour, value and size. We hope you all have a lovely half term holiday and look forward to seeing you back at school on Monday 6th June!



This week in key stage one we have finished our topic of 'The Secret Sky Garden' by sequencing pictures from the story, discussing what we liked and did not like about the story and finally writing a book review. In maths we have focused on money, making sure we can recognise coins and notes and putting them in value order. We also pretended to go to the toyshop to buy two items, worked out the total cost using lines or a tens and ones grid and the coins we could use to pay. In Science we have been predicting what will happen to the cress seeds that we planted. We have put them in strange places including the fridge! I wonder which ones will grow the best. We hope you have a lovely half term and look forward to seeing you all soon.
