Music Tuition

We are pleased to be able to offer music tuition across our partnership for September 2022 for children in Years 1 and 2.

These are session parents can book and pay for via the website on the poster.



Mr Harpham is a fully qualified music teacher who currently works at the Lionwood Schools which are part of our trust. From September, he will be working across all schools, offering paid for music sessions. Sessions will be 30 minutes per week at a cost of £36 per month, which can be cancelled at any time. All instruments are provided and include guitar, drums, keyboard and vocal. They will take place in school during the school day. Full details can be found on the website.

On top of these sessions, we are currently looking at ways we can use some of our school budget to pay for his support in improving our whole school music curriculum. This will be through him supporting our music leads, team teaching with staff, putting on school performances and providing training for staff.

We also plan to support some group sessions through our pupil premium plan for children who are eligible.

Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

EYFS





This week the children all took part in fruit tasting! Thank you so much for your kind donations, it created some wonderful learning opportunities. The children passed the fruits around describing how they felt and smelt before using child friendly knives to chop and taste the fruit. We spoke about our favourites and some of us even went on to make a healthy fruit and smoothie shop! We have been using positional language to go on treasure hunts and make maps around the classroom. We have set up our own obstacle courses outside and used positional language to travel across them indifferent ways. The Kingfisher children are all very excited to take part in sports day next week. We have been practising lots of different team games, cheering each other on and having lots of fun taking part. In class we have been listening to traditional African music and exploring African instruments. We have been making African huts using various craft materials and exploring the types of animals that live on the African plains.

Key Stage 1



This week in key stage one we have continued to learn about The Great Fire of London. We found out who Samuel Peeps was and what he did when the fire was coming too close to his house. He also spoke to the king about how they could stop the fire spreading. We talked about what we should do if there is a fire at school or at home.

In maths this week we have been focusing on subtraction. We used a tens and ones grid to answer the number sentences. It was trickier when we had to exchange a ten. At the end of the week we challenged the children with a mixture of addition and subtraction number sentences. They really impressed us with how carefully they looked at the symbol in each one to understand if they had to add or take away. Some children moved onto some subtraction word problems, they had to read them carefully as there was more than one step to find the answer.

We have been practicing for sports day this week and look forward to showing you our games next week.
