Dear Nightingale Families,

We can't quite believe we're about to enter into the final week of the school year! This week has been a challenging one due to further Covid-19 cases amongst the staff team and some children.

While we're now in the 'Living with Covid' phase, staff and children are still required to stay away from work and school for a period of time (5 days for adults and 3 days for children).

For the majority of this week we were unable to open the nursery due to an outbreak amongst the nursery team, leaving staff levels too low to keep to the ratios required. We are hopeful the team will be well enough to return next week so the children can enjoy the last week of term.

As you will know, we are expecting very high temperatures at the beginning of next week. Please ensure children have their water bottles and sun hats in school daily. While temperatures in school have felt uncomfortable, we will continue to restrict the time spent outside, particularly out of the sun. If you child won't be in school, please inform us in the usual way.

Due to the high temperatures, we have moved the movie afternoon to Tuesday so the children will be inside for the hottest part of the day and we hope that the Water Extravaganza can go ahead on Thursday.

We are looking forward to next week where lots of exciting this will be taking place. Please see the diary below for key dates and times. We have also added next year's term dates to the bottom of this newsletter, with white dates showing all days children are in school. Children will return to school on Tuesday 6th September.

There is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support.



EYFS





In Kingfisher class this week the children have been learning the story 'The Enormous Turnip'. We have had lots of fun acting out the story, performing it with actions and creating our own story puppets the retell the story with our friends. We also made our own versions of the story using new characters and a different vegetable! In Phonics we have been recapping all of the digraphs and trigraphs we have learnt this year and using them to write our own captions using funny pictures as a stimulus. In maths we have been exploring patterns using shapes, colours and numbers and a variety of maths resources. We created and described our own repeating patterns and looked carefully at number sequences to find the pattern. The children all took part in our sponsored event on Monday where they had 2 minutes to complete a range of fun activities. Our favourite was the penguin shuffle! Please remember to return all reading and library books next week. We will be collecting all books on Monday, so please check bookbags to ensure they are inside. We hope you have a lovely weekend and look forward to celebrating our last week of Reception with the children next week!

Key Stage 1



This week has been all about RSE (Relationship Education) focusing on bullying, being unique, naming parts of our bodies and looking at the differences between boys and girls. All the children have been very interested and sensible and have enjoyed the sessions. They have worked in year groups as the syllabus is slightly different in each year.

Our topic Paddington has concluded this week by watching Paddington in bitesize pieces over the week. The children's knowledge of the Great Fire of London is amazing. This week we thought about how London was changed after the Great Fire such as houses further apart, straight roads, houses made from brick and stone and water pipes made from a different material to wood.
