

# Nightingale Infant and Nursery School Weekly Newsletter 09.09.2022

Dear Nightingale Families,

I am sure you are all aware by now of the sad announcement of the death of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. As a community, our thoughts and prayers are with her family at this difficult time.

We would like to remind you that we will remain open throughout the period of public mourning. The day of the Queen's funeral will be a public holiday and therefore if it falls on a week day, schools alongside most businesses will likely close. We will share more information as it becomes available.

Today we talked with the children, in an age-appropriate way, about the death of her Majesty, addressing the news, answering any questions children may have and providing support. With our jubilee celebrations being quite recent, the children have a good knowledge of the many aspects of her life and the impact she had on our country and across the world.

As we all come to terms with what happened, we know that some children will be affected by this in particular. We will keep the school routine as normal and continue to provide children with time to talk if they need.

If your child needs extra support, please let us know, our pastoral and class teams are always here to listen.

It's been a pleasure to welcome all of our new families into school this week as well as welcome familiar faces back after the summer. The children have settled into school fantastically after a long break and it's so lovely to hear the building full of chatter and laughter.

We are busy finalising plans for this term. Please keep an eye on the dates section of the newsletter each week where information is regularly updated.

While testing is no longer required, Covid-19 still remains very present in the community and we ask families to continue to be vigilant. If your child presents with any of the symptoms, we ask that they remain at home and test where possible. If positive, children should isolate for 3 full days, day 0 being the day they first show symptoms/test positive. Where a test isn't possible, children isolate until they no longer have a high temperature/feel unwell. Children can return to school after the 3-day isolation period or later if they are still presenting symptoms. The same advice is for adults however adults are required to isolate for 5 days.

#### Communication

Please could I ask that parents email the office email rather than sending things directly to individual staff, if you have their email addresses. The office email is checked daily and throughout the day, however this isn't the case for most staff due to other commitments. By doing this, we can ensure your email is passed to someone who is able to pick this up quickly, particularly if the intended recipient is absent.

Please continue to send direct emails to the SENDCo and PSA where matters are not urgent.

For anything needing to be discussed or where you need to communicate things quickly, we strongly advise you to speak to someone at the gate, the class teacher, or give the office a call.

#### **Food Vouchers**

All infant school children are entitled to free school meals. However, if you receive the following benefits, you might be entitled to receive extra financial support. The children often get free spaces for holiday activities too.

- Universal Credit with an annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190

The Norfolk County Council are issuing food vouchers for entitled parents/carers for September and October. If you have not yet applied, please complete the online form as soon as possible. You will find out instantly if you are eligible. Once confirmed, please email the school office so that we can update our records and issue the vouchers.

Any families already receiving support last year and their siblings who started in September do not need to re-apply.

#### **School Council**

#### **Phonics**

Welcome back! It has been fantastic seeing the children settle into their new classes this week.

We are really excited to report that we are beginning a new journey as we take on The Little Wandle phonics and reading programme. Starting this year, we have been busy updating resources and attending lots of super training. We will be sharing this with you through a parent's phonics café, date to be confirmed soon! Phonics lessons will continue to take place daily.

Previously we would read once a week with individual readers, we will now be implementing a two-week rolling rota. In week 1 the children will be reading in groups for a decoding session where we focus on the word reading, then a prosody session where we notice the punctuation and practice reading with expression (reading in the character's voice). In week 2 the children will then focus on comprehension through their guided reading sessions. You will still receive decodable books set for the children every week. We are thrilled to be starting this journey and we are so excited to share it with you all.





### **Parent Forum**



Mrs Boyce will be running the Parent Forum this year. If you have been on the forum and are happy to continue, please let a member staff If know. The Forum tends to meet on Zoom at 9:15 am on a rotation of the days of the week. We will have some meetings in school this year. We discuss topics such as homework, transition, communication, holidays, absence and many more. #### Slippers



Nightingale children started to wear slippers last year. The slippers must be simple with hard soles and backs. The children loved wearing them through the winter. They promote calmness and relaxation and in turn creates a calm learning environment. It also means the carpets keep cleaner with year-round use of the field, which is much nicer for the children to sit on as well as keeping the cleaners happy! We ask that the children start to bring in their slippers over the next few weeks. The children then have school shoes or trainers for outside and slippers for inside. Please note that trainers are not permitted as an alternative for an indoor shoe.

Parents wishing their child to continue to wear school shoes all day are kindly asked to send in a pair of trainers each day so children can use these at playtimes and lunch times.
