

# Weduc

Following feedback about the current apps that we use to communicate with parents, our office team have been working hard to research alternative options to ensure we have the best software to communicate with our families.

We have been preparing for the implementation of a system called Weduc which will embody all of the functionality of our existing systems of Parentmail and Seesaw, whilst also enabling direct communication with the school, and access to Pupil Asset and Tapestry.

Therefore, Weduc will be used for our communications for the whole school and home learning for our KS1 learning. Tapestry will continue for our Early Years pupils. Previously we used Seesaw to communicate what we have been doing in class whilst we could not have visitors to the school. Now that parents can come in to the school again, we will only be using Weduc for home learning. The KS1 curriculum is very different from EYFS so will therefore not be used in the same way as Tapestry is for EYFS.

There is a newsfeed within the system that can be used to keep up with our news and activities which is very similar to the Facebook newsfeed, and the internal messaging system is very similar to Outlook.

You will be able to access Pupil Asset and Tapestry directly through 'The Hub' and you will be able to report child absence through the system too.

The messaging within the app will allow all parent/school communication to be contained within the system to avoid the need to use generic mailboxes like the office email addresses and will therefore be able to be monitored by the whole office team.

Currently this is being trialed by a selection of our Friends committee members across the Partnership and our staff to ensure a smooth rollout after October half term.

We are excited to share this new system with you and will be sharing more, including feedback we receive during the trial, in newsletters leading up to half term.

# **Nursery Lunches**

After half term we will be offering all our nursery children the option of a lunch from the brilliant Norse team in our kitchen. We have a new menu from next half term which will be shared with all families before half term.

Therefore, if your child stays for lunch at nursery, you will be able to choose from; a hot meal, a hot vegetarian option, a jacket potato, or a school packed lunch. All come with a dessert.

These will be charged at £2.30 per meal and will be invoiced to you in a similar way to your Nursery invoice. Once the system is settled in, we will look to invoice for meals through the Weduc system.

# **Fundraising for a Partnership Minibus**

This year, the Partnership would like to work together and focus their fundraising towards purchasing a minibus for the two schools.

Some ideas we have had to date include:

- sponsored walk/bike/scooter of 1.7 miles to take place in the Summer term. This is the distance between the two schools;
- writing out to local companies and asking them if they would like to contribute towards our cause with a view to advertising their company on the bus if they are willing to donate a minimum amount;
- we will be applying to a variety of grants to help towards our total too.

We will have a scale in the front foyer of each school showing how close we are to reaching our goal and there will be ideas promoted throughout the year.

The benefits of the mini-bus for our children will include:

- better links with the community we can take the children out for community litter picks to link with our eco schools ethos - we can take the children to local care homes to read with/sing to the residents - trips to the library and local places such as Marriotts Way;
- ability to take children out on local visits the library for reading sessions the church for art sessions small group outings which could include the councils of both schools working together;
- increasing opportunities for the children if there is a club at one school that hasn't had the take up at the other school, we can bus the interested children to the school with the club to enable them to take part and bring them back again this could include music tuition, dance classes etc;
- enabling opportunities for sporting events between the schools being able to have sports tournaments between the schools making use of the extensive field at Drayton;
- flexibility around trips for children that have difficulty being on noisy coaches and change in routine, we can take a small group of children in the minibus when we have large school trips.

The possibilities are huge and we would be very grateful for any support you can give us with this.

We welcome any ideas towards helping us reach our goal this year – we will need to raise approximately £40,000 so every little will help!

Additionally, if anyone works somewhere that offers match funding and would be willing to put our cause forward for this, we would be thrilled.

# Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

EYFS



In Nuthatch this week the children have continued getting to know each other and the adults in the room, they were very excited to welcome back Mr Eldridge our student volunteer this Friday, he has been missed! The children are getting very good at putting their wellies on to go and explore the outside garden, well done Nuthatch! In Kingfisher class the children have all been learning about space as part of International Space Week. We have read 'The Smeds and the Smoos' and 'Baby Brains' and thought about what life is like in outer space. We collected moon rocks outside and explored patterns using space dust. We have explored colour mixing while designing our own aliens, used various construction materials to create our own rockets and painted planets using special puffy moon paints! We learnt about Tim Peake, a British astronaut who lived on the international space station. In maths the Kingfishers have been comparing amounts using greater then, less than and equal to. In Phonics the children have learnt 4 new sounds and have also started segmenting using a phoneme frame this week. Great learning everyone!

# Key Stage 1

This week in key stage one we have made egg box bird feeders. We then wrote our own instructions of how to make an egg box bird feeder. There was a lot to think about; a title, numbers, bossy, short sentences, capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and time words (first, next, after that, finally). We have written our instructions up neatly so we can put them on display around school.

In maths this week we have been learning about subtraction. We solved subtraction number sentences by using concrete objects, then by drawing pictures of tens and ones and finally using a tens and ones grid. It was a challenge to use exchanging if the number went into the next ten. We also looked at word problems to challenge our understanding of what we had learnt.

In science we have investigated our sense of smell. We had lots of jars to sniff to see if we could guess what they were. Some were delicious and others were disgusting!

Thank you for attending our Maths Big Share this morning, we look forward to seeing you all in school again soon.

# Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key: White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
