It's been another busy week at Nightingale!



Web Parent Portal

If you prefer to use a computer, and you would rather not use an app, you can always login to our Parent Portal using a web browser: http://secure.pupilasset.com, and select 'First time logging in?'.

How to download the app onto your phone/tablet



- 1. Download Pupil Asset Parents
- 2. Open App
- 3. Click on 'First Login/Forgot Password?'
- 4. Enter the email address we have registered for you at the school
- 5. This will send you an email. Open the email and click 'Reset password here'
- 6. Enter the password you would like to use, confirm it and click 'reset password'
- 7. Go back to the app and enter your email address password
- 8. You will be asked to set a 4 digit pin
- 9. Enter this number and click on 'Set Pin'

How to select meals

- 1. Log in via app or web Parent Portal
- 2. You will then see your child(ren) listed

- Click on the child you wish to enter lunches for 3.
- 4. Click on 'Meals'
- 5. Click on the day you wish to choose lunch for
- 6. Select from:

Tots2Teens

Bookings are now being taken for the Tots2Teens activities taking place in the Winter school holidays. A range of activities are available including cookery, sports, arts and technology, the brochure listing details of all activities that are taking place can be found here.

We are a Big Norfolk Holiday Fun (BNHF) provider meaning that children and young people who are eligible for means-tested free school meals can attend our sessions this Winter for FREE. Reading at NIANS



High quality texts and reading are at the very heart of our school. The children are given opportunities to read and to listen to stories at many points during the day at Nightingale. There are many different types of reading in school – shared reading, guided reading, quiet reading (ERIC), individual reading and 'reading for pleasure' plus of course reading at home.

In school we aim to hear your child read individually once a week and change their reading book once a week too. In very busy weeks at school, it's sometimes not possible to hear every child read E.g. in the run up to Christmas. For the book to be changed we must have evidence that the book has been read and understood. If you would like more than one reading book a week, please discuss this with the class teacher. Your child will not be heard reading more than once but the book can be changed at the teacher's discretion.

It must be remembered that racing through the colours is not a mark of success.

Reading for enjoyment and understanding, being able to predict and discuss what has happened etc. Reading is so much more than decoding text.

We also supplement our reading with books from our beautiful library. The library was revamped by the fantastic Friends of Nightingale in 2019 and is a very special place in our school.

This is our library timetable – children need to bring the book back to be able to change it.

EYFS

Key Stage 1

In key stage one this week we have continued learning about emperor penguins. We have made lovely leaflets containing all the facts we know about them. We had to think about the presentation of the leaflets too, making sure we formed letters correctly, used capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

In maths this week we have been learning more about addition. We recapped adding by using tens and ones then moved on to adding using a number line. Some of us had a go at drawing our own number lines, we practised doing this with a ruler first. We also looked at addition word problems. We had to remember to use one of the strategies to solve the word problems and not just guess at the answer!

In science we have discussed how animals adapt to live in Antarctica. Did you know emperor penguins have special fat in their feet to keep them warm on the ice?

Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key: White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
