- Reception Christmas Nativity



#### Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

#### **EYFS**



It has certainly been a magical week this week as the children prepare for their Nativity performance next week! In preparation the children have explored the nativity story through books and small world resources. They have had a go at building a stable for Mary and Joseph, and created their own nativity pictures using natural resources and paint. We have sequenced the events that took place in Bethlehem on that very special night and put up our own nativity scenes in the classroom. On Thursday we celebrated the start of Advent by putting up our class Christmas tree and sharing a special story. We would love to see your Christmas decorations at home, if you are putting your tree up this weekend please share a photograph on Tapestry! The children love sharing these special moments with their friends in school. If you have not yet done so, please do log on to Weduc to acquire your Nativity ticket, these are free, up to 2 tickets are allocated per child. The children have been rehearsing every day and are so excited to perform for you!

<u>Kingfisher Messages:</u> Please send your child into school on Thursday wearing black leggings or joggers with their coloured t-shirt. This information was sent home last week, if you have lost your costume letter and are not sure what your child needs to wear, please speak to an EYFS member of staff at the end of the day. The children have made their own costumes and accessories in school which they will wear over the top of their t-shirts.

#### **Nuthatch Messages:**

Key Stage 1



In key stage one this week we have continued to base our English lessons around the book Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers. First the children sequenced the story using pictures from the book. Next, the children re-told the story using the pictures to help them. We discussed that a good story needed to have capital letters, finger spaces, full stops, adjectives, conjunctions (but, so, because) and feeling words. It is a lot to remember what you have to think about when you are also trying to form your letters correctly and write in an appropriate size.

In maths this week we have been learning about division. We discussed how to share an amount equally. We did this practically first by using two plates and a pot of cubes (concrete), then we moved on to doing this by drawing plates or a bar model (pictorially), finally we tried solving division word problems (abstract).

You should have received a letter about your child's costume for the Christmas performance at the church. Please send the costume into school by Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> December in a named bag, thank you.

#### Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key: White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
