Dear Nightingale Families,

Strike Action

You will likely be aware that one of the teaching unions has held a ballot, which is proposing strikes by their members this year. The reasons behind this are complex, and this industrial action is likely to affect the majority of our teaching staff. Please let me reassure you that our teachers do care very much about the children in their classes and any decision to strike will not be taken lightly. The National Education Union has announced a series of strikes which impact the operation of our school. They are:

- Wednesday 1 February 2023 National strike action
- Wednesday 1 March 2023 Regional strike action
- Wednesday 15 March 2023 National strike action
- Wednesday 16 March 2023 National strike action

The other teaching unions have not announced any strikes at this time.

Leaders have meetings on Monday with the local authority and the trust so we hope to update you early next week. Staff are not required to tell us if they plan to strike until the day of the strike, therefore making planning extremely challenging. Many staff have shared their intention to strike so I am hopeful we will be able to gain a greater understanding as to our staffing levels ahead of the strike day and plan accordingly.



Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

EYFS





In EYFS this week the children have enjoyed reading 'The Naughty Bus' by Jan and Jerry Oke. The children have learnt how to make their own buses out of junk modelling. The children have explored travel through role play. Our playground was turned into a busy bus station! We made tickets, road signs and buildings using construction and loose parts. Some of the children went on to write captions about where they would like to go on their bus! We have used paints and stamps to create vehicle patterns and drawn pictures of us with our friends on the bus. Some children have also shared their own experiences of riding on the bus, if you are travelling somewhere this weekend we would love to see a picture on Tapestry! How are you travelling? We have discussed lots of other modes of transport, how many can you name?

Kingfisher: The Kingfishers have been looking at ordinality and missing numbers this week. They made their own pictures of the numberblocks and practiced their number formation. We have also learnt 4 new digraphs. So far we have looked at: sh, ch, ai, ee, igh, th, oa, oo (long), oo (short), ar, or. We went to the school library this week. All children have chosen a book to share at home. Please look after these books and return them week beginning the 30th. Polite reminder, at the end of the day it is often quite difficult to see all the adults on the playground. As soon as you have collected your child, please exit the playground so we can see who else is waiting. Please also remind your children that the sand pit and slide should not be used before and after school. Thank you! Have a lovely weekend.

Key Stage 1



In English this week we have been continuing to write for different purposes, creating our own informal postcards based around our topic book 'Man on the Moon'. We even went on a trip to the moon and thought about what we would be able to see, hear, feel and even smell!

The children have been loving learning about the history of space travel; the first people in space, the first rockets and space stations and trying hard to remember and read the years these events happened. In Ravens we even watched some space rockets land back on earth as they were so interested!

In Maths we have been looking at fractions; quarters, halves, thirds and three quarters. We have used a variety of strategies to find these fractions. We started with concrete objects, sharing cubes out, next we moved on to drawing sharing circles and finally we used a bar model. Next week we will be looking at multiplication and division, if you have a chance please practise counting in twos, fives and tens at home.

In PSHE we have been looking into the jobs people do and what attributes we would need to do these, such as being caring and kind in line with our FLOCK values. The children then thought about what they would love to try as a job when they are older- we have future dance teachers, vets and astronauts in our midst!

PE

Next week PE is on Thursday for the whole school apart from Chaffinch Chaffinch will have PE on Tuesday
