#### **Parent Survey**



We had an assembly in the hall where we saw the special protective kit and clothing firefighters have to wear, and we saw some of the tools kept on a fire engine and talked through what they do. The children heard the fire engine's siren and horn, and listened to what a smoke alarm sounds like. We hope all of the children really enjoyed the experience – some of them are now inspired to join the fire service themselves!

Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!
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EYFS	We have been 'on the move' again this week as we continue our topic on transport and,
1 the	particularly this week, buses. We have made bus timetables and some detailed maps of
	journeys that you might make by bus in and around Taverham. In the outside area we made
T T	an enormous bus together – it even had wings! Unfortunately, the wheels kept falling off so
	we needed a team of mechanics with tools to fix it.
2	We have also been thinking about people who help us in the community with a special focus
	on the police officers, paramedics and emergency services who keep us safe. On Thursday
	some fire-fighters came to visit the school and they brought their fire-engine and showed us
	the hose, uniform and other equipment that they use. You might have even heard the siren!
	We are sure that there are now girls and boys in Early Years who want to do one of these
	important jobs when they grow up.
	In maths Nuthatch have been focussing on the numbers 1,2 and 3 and have been using the
	story of Goldilocks to support their work. In Kingfisher we have used the song "Five Little
	Speckled Frogs" to find different ways of making 5. See if your child is beginning to
	remember different ways of making 5 such as 3 and 2, or 4 and 1 or use 5 objects at home to
	explore this key area of learning.
Key Stage 1	This week in key stage one our English work has continued to be based on the book 'Man on
6	the Moon' by Simon Bartram. The aliens in the story are very funny. The children chose the
	alien they thought was most interesting to describe. We tried to make our sentences as
	interesting as possible by including adjectives and conjunctions e.g. The alien has a sparkly,
	green hat because he has a cold head.
AF	In our next English session, we pretended to be an alien on the moon. The children loved this
120	activity and thought of some fantastic names for themselves. They also thought about any
11	special powers they may have. We had aliens that were invisible, could play the piano, fly,
	turn things to larva and many other ideas.
-	The visit from the fire service this week was very exciting. Please talk about this at home as
	we will be writing about it in school next week.
	In maths this week we have been learning about multiplication and division. We solved
	multiplication and division number sentences by using objects, drawing groups or using a bar
	model. In the last session we discussed multiplication being commutative (it can be written
	either way around) e.g. 2x6=12, 6x2=12 but division is not as the largest number has to come first e.g. 12÷6=2, 12÷2=6.

## Norfolk County Council 2022-2023

#### Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.



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Key : White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
