Dear Nightingale Families,

It's been a busy week at Nightingale with lots of visits to monitor the progress we're making towards school improvement.

On Wednesday Sam Thorpe, the teaching and curriculum lead from the trust, spent the morning looking at the teaching of phonics and maths. She was impressed with the learning behaviours of the children across the school...they were amazing! She noted the significant progress which has been made since implementing Little Wandle in September and praised the team for their hard work. Kingfisher class blew her away with their learning and how beautifully they listened on the carpet and took part in the lesson.

On Thursday we had a full audit of phonics from the Wensum Hub which we arranged last term. Funded by the Department for Education, they support other schools in the county to achieve excellence in teaching reading and early language development. This will continue to support the school and provide us with next steps in our improvement journey.

Thank you again for completing the parent questionnaire. A full summary will be sent to you next week. An area we have been working on and is something many parents would welcome is more information about what your child is learning in school, particularly the differences in expectations between Year 1 and Year 2. On Monday we will be sending home an overview of the Key Stage 1 curriculum for this half term, alongside knowledge organisers which includes home learning activities. These will also be available on our website.

Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

EYFS





This week the children have enjoyed reading the story 'Cinderella'. We thought about our school values and decided that some of the characters in the story were not being kind and caring at all! We tried to help Cinderella by thinking about how she could get to the ball really quickly to have more time dancing with the prince! We designed and created our own mode of transport using junk modelling and craft materials. In maths the children have all been consolidating our subitising skills by recognising groups of 3, 4, 5 and even 6 without counting! We have looked carefully at the patterns groups of objects make to help us identify them quickly.

Kingfishers: It was a week of firsts for the Kingfishers this week! We did our first PE lesson which was lots of fun! We created a big top tent using a parachute and practiced our rolling and catching skills ready for a big circus performance. Please do remember to wear your PE kit every Wednesday. We also attended our first FLOCK star of the week assembly, well done to our 2 FLOCK stars who demonstrated how fair they were this week. We also had our first music lesson where the children had to listen and respond to a piece of music. We danced around the classroom and described how it made us feel. We also had to find the pulse of a piece of music and practice clapping, stomping and bopping to it! We would like to say how proud we were of all the children this Friday. We had a special tennis lesson in the hall and all the children joined in with their listening ears, looking eyes and brain boxes switched on full power! We had lots of compliments from staff around the school at how well behaved the Kingfishers were. Well done everyone! Have a fantastic weekend.

Key Stage 1



This week in key stage one we have introduced our new book by showing the children a picture of Bob. We looked carefully at the picture to see what we could find out about Bob. The children were great detectives and noticed Bob had a statue of an astronaut, a photo of a rocket landing on the moon and even an alien peeping through the window. Next, we thought about questions we would like to ask Bob, starting with the words What, Where, When, Why and Who. Finally, we wrote a letter to Bob. There was a lot to think about, where to write the address, the date, a greeting, our reason for writing, our questions and a concluding sentence.

In maths this week we have focussed on addition and subtraction. We practised counting on using a bar model, using number bonds to ten twenty and a hundred and being able to write number sentences for fact families e.g. 12+8=20, 8+12=20, 20-8=12, 20-12=8. Finally, we tried to solve some addition one and two step word problems.

After lunch every day we have been doing a ten-minute Mastering Number session. The aim of Mastering Number is to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense for all children from Reception through to Year 1 and Year 2. The aim over time is that children will leave KS1 with fluency in calculation and a confidence and flexibility with number.

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.
