Dear Nightingale Families,



#### Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

#### **EYFS**





The children have continued their learning about transport this week by jumping on board a little red steam train! The children have loved reading our topic book 'The Train Ride' by June Crebbin. We have talked about all the things we might see out of the window if we were on a train journey. Some of us have painted or drawn pictures and had a go at writing sentences about a journey. We have used loose parts to build our own trains outside and made tickets and maps to go on adventures around our playground. We have sung songs about trains and used musical instruments to imitate the sounds of a train clickety-clacking down the track! The **Nuthatch** children have been focussing on the number 4 this week by making trains with 4 carriages. The children had to add 4 objects to their train track using careful counting, 4 trees, 4 people, 4 animals! They also made buildings out of squares and rectangles which of course have 4 sides! The **Kingfishers** have been furthering their understanding of the composition of 6 and 7 using Hungarian number frames. We have also completed our learning of phase 3 digraphs this week by focussing on 'air' and 'er'. 
Key Stage 1



This week in key stage one we have continued our learning about Bob the Man on the Moon. We used pictures to sequence the story and then wrote the story in our own words. The children worked hard to remember some of the story language, use time words to start their sentences (first, next, after that, finally), add interesting adjectives and include conjunctions (but, so, because).

In maths this week we have been learning about statistics. We made tally charts of our favourite colour. We then used this information to make a pictogram, it was tricky when each picture was worth more than one. Finally we made a block graph and answered questions about what it shows.

In art we have been learning about self-portraits. We watched a video clip of how to draw a self-portrait and practised on a white board before having a go on paper. We are looking forward to painting self-portraits next week.

#### Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key: White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
