

# **Community Events**



#### **EYFS**



What a busy week we have had in EYFS this week! The children really enjoyed learning about space through their wonderdome experience, some of us went on to paint and model solar systems using paint and playdough. Thursday was world book day, all the children looked incredible! We spent the day sharing our favourite stories and exploring with puppets and costumes to create our own stories. Our topic this week was all about the police, we were very lucky to have two lovely police officers visit us in school with their police car this week! Every child was given the opportunity to ask questions, try on a real police hat and sit in the driver's seat of the police car! In Kingfisher class the children have focussed on chunking longer words to read and write them, for example: l-a-p/t-o-p laptop. In maths the children have been counting beyond 10 to 20 and 30. We have also explored the composition of numbers 6-10 in greater depth. In Nuthatch the children have looked closely at the patterns on a police uniform and made their own patterned police cars. They have also started creating repeating patterns using maths resources in the classroom.


#### Key Stage 1



In key stage one this week we have continued to learn about the alternative traditional tale of Rapunzel. We described what Rapunzel and the witch looked like e.g. long golden hair, and thought about what their character is like e.g. lonely, scared, wicked. We had a fantastic day on Thursday dressed up as book characters. We enjoyed playing 'drop and read' in the afternoon where we had to find a book and read every time we heard the bell ringing. In maths this week we have recapped 2D and 3D shape. The children worked with their special partner to describe a 3D shape. We thought about the names of the shape, what it looked like, how many faces, vertices and edges it has. We also described the 2D shapes we could see on the faces of the 3D shape.

In Geography this week we discussed what physical and human features are, having learnt about these last half term. Next, we went on a walk around the school site looking for different human and physical features.

### Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key: White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
