

EYFS





As you know this half term, we have been thinking about people who help us in the community, including fire-fighters, police officers and doctors and nurses. This week we have been focussing on local people in the community. We had a very successful visit to Taverham Library where Paul, the librarian showed us how the books were organised and read a story to us. Thanks to the parent helpers who helped us with the visit. Remember, if you are not a member of the library you can join for free and take out up to fifteen books! We also had a visit from Mrs. Stubbs our cook who prepares all our lovely hot dinners and school packed lunches. She showed us her special thermometer that she uses to check that food is cooked and she brought the biggest tin of baked beans we have ever seen! Did you know that Mrs. Stubbs and her team prepare all the dinners for Chapel Break School as well? Nuthatch did some lovely sensory work with red lentils this week, moving them around to make patterns and marks. They also used the scales to investigate weighing objects which we will continue to learn about next week. Perhaps, at home you could compare the weight of tins and packets and even start to make a little shop. Remember just to use pennies for now-rampant inflation has not yet hit the world of infant teaching!

Key Stage 1



This week in key stage one our English lessons have been focussed around how we can defeat the witch from the Rapunzel story. The children had fantastic ideas, which included; stealing her wand, building a trap, making a potion, giving her food with poison in and turning her to stone. Next, we thought about writing instructions about how to defeat a witch. We had a practise writing instructions about how to make a jam sandwich first.



In maths this week we have been learning about time. The children focussed on telling and drawing the time for o'clock, half past, quarter past, quarter to and in five-minute intervals on an analogue clock. We practised solving word problems involving time too.

In art we have been learning about the artist Paul Klee. We have compared his work to Pablo Picasso who we learn about

last half term. We have experimented with drawing the school using shapes and making patterns. Our final piece of art will be a castle made with shapes, water colours and patterns.

Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key: White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
