




# **New toilets in Kingfisher Class**

Kingfisher class were excited to be back in their classroom this week after being 'rehomed' for the past few weeks while their toilets were refurbished.

Mr Tame, our Trust Site Manager, has been working tirelessly to get these finished as soon as possible. As you will be aware, school budgets are more challenging than ever so opportunities to improve the school site can be limited. The school is provided with a small amount of money each year from the government for essential repairs. Mr Tame's time has enabled us to refurbish both the Key Stage 1 toilets and now Kingfisher toilets due to only needing to purchase the materials. Mr Tame's time is provided by the trust, meaning we have been able to rapidly improve many areas of the school such as redecoration of classrooms, repairs to the school roof, new fencing and refurbished toilets. His next project in the coming months is to completely refurbish the school mobile and build a low climbing wall on the field for the children, which will both provide more opportunities at playtime and lunchtime.

#### Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

**EYFS** 





This week we finally got to meet the strange creature that is the Bog Baby. We saw its round blue body, its spiky tail, its mouse-like ears and its toes that it likes to suck! We made some models of the Bog Baby using blue playdough, straws, pipe-cleaners, feathers and googly eyes. They were awesome! We learnt a lot from the book about keeping promises and how to care for animals. We all like looking at bugs and mini-beasts and we might want to put them in a pot and take them home but remember to always quickly return animals to their micro-habitats where they like to live. Nursery children have really enjoyed the book and have made an amazing Bog Baby display. They are going to continue to explore the themes and ideas from this lovely book next week.

In maths we have become so good at finding number bonds to five that we have moved on to finding two numbers that, added together, make ten. We have used our sausages game on the white board to help us with this. But we have burnt so many sausages! Please don't tell Mrs. Stubbs, or she might not cook any of her delicious butcher's best chipolatas for us!

#### Key Stage 1



In key stage one this week we have continued to learn about wolves. We wrote our wolf facts in four sections, appearance, diet, habitat and family. Did you know... wolves live for about eight years in the wild but up to twenty years in captivity and wolves can run thirty-six to thirty-eight miles per hour. The children tried very hard to include capital letters, full stops and conjunctions (and, so, but, because) in their writing.

In maths this week we have been learning about repeating shape patterns, direction and position. The children enjoyed describing where the teddy was sitting e.g. on the chair, under the chair, beside the chair, behind the chair, in between the chair and the box. This is a good game to play at home to support your child with using the appropriate language to describe position.

In art we have continued looking at the work of Barbara Hepworth. We have experimented moulding the clay, joining two pieces of clay together, making a hole in the clay and making different textures on the clay. Next, we designed our own sculptures in our sketch books and finally we have started to make our sculptures.

#### Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key: White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2nd & 5th September, 3rd January, 17th April and 24th July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
