Learning taking place in our classes this week & key messages!

EYFS





In EYFS this week the Nuthatch children have continued learning about Bog Baby and where he lives. They have explored pond animals and thought about the life cycle of a frog. The Kingfishers have read another traditional tale this week, The Frog Prince. We have enjoyed making our own frog princes by carefully cutting circles of different sizes and adding a very sparkly crown. We have also explored colour mixing, experimenting with different shades of green by mixing blue and yellow to paint a frog. Some of us even had a go at writing speech bubbles for the frog or the princess, thinking carefully about how they were feeling at different points in the story.

In maths, Nuthatch have been practicing their careful counting skills, remembering to say 1 number for each object they count. The Kingfishers have been exploring capacity this week, counting animals into pots of different sizes and measuring how many cups of water it takes to fill various buckets and measuring cylinders. We hope you all have a wonderful half term, and look forward to seeing you after the holiday! As the weather is warming up, please ensure that children return to school with an appropriate sun hat and apply sun cream in the morning before school.

Key Stage 1



In key stage one this week we have thought about a forest which is the setting in our book 'The Last Wolf'. We watched a video clip of a forest and used our senses to describe what we could see, hear, smell and touch. Next, we used these ideas to write a descriptive poem with a partner. The children had excellent ideas, which included 'I can see the tall, swaying trees. I can hear the whistling wind blowing the crunchy leaves. I can feel the rough, bumpy bark. I can smell the fresh morning air. Finally, we performed our poems to the rest of the class.

In maths this week we have been learning about fractions of a quantity. Year 1's have been learning how to half and quarter numbers using physical objects and sharing circles. Year 2's have recapped these alongside learning thirds and three quarters, using bar models.

We have enjoyed our art unit this half term, exploring the work of Barbara Hepworth. We have now all made our own mini sculptures using clay, making sure we include holes (just like Barbara Hepworth!), curved lines, different textures and joining at least two parts together. The children's creativity has really shone!

Norfolk Model Calendar
