Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key : White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 4th & 5th September, 3 January, 28th March and 22 July. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.



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Speech and Language

What

- I work with our Trust Speech and Language Therapist, Suz Hinchcliffe, and the NHS speech and language therapists. I arrange for Suz to come into school to carry out initial assessments, she will then email me the SaLT notes and a plan
- For a new child to speech, I will set up a folder, a book and any resources required for the plan. I will then meet the child and start working on the intervention with the child following the plan. I will incorporate games and play at some point
- The class TA will then have some time to go through the plan with me so that they may continue with class sessions. • I will review the children's progress and arrange a review with Suz Hinchcliffe or put in a request for support from NHS
- I absolutely love my job, I have a passion for helping young people and enabling them to communicate better. Speech,
