Dear Nightingale Families,

Welcome to the summer term at Nightingale, it's so lovely to see everyone back at school ready for a busy term!

You will have received knowledge organisers and overviews of what your child will be learning in school this half term. As well as this, we have also sent our information regarding our Relationship Education which takes place in all year groups each year. All of this information is also available on our school website.

As you may know, the SATS (statutory assessments) which always took place at the end of Year 2 have changed this year. While they are no longer statutory, it is recommended the materials are used to support teachers in making assessments shared with the Junior School and with parents at the end of the year. The materials and questions are in the style of assessments and teaching tools we use in school throughout the year, so the children are very used to seeing them. These will be completed throughout May, either as a whole class, in small groups or on a 1:1 basis where needed. If you have any questions, please speak to your child's class teacher first. We will not be referring to these assessments as SATS or tests with the children.

For pupils in Year 1, they will complete the Phonics Screening Check in June. This is a check set by the Government for all children in Year 1. Children complete assessments like this throughout the year to check on their progress so they shouldn't notice anything different when completing the check during the assessment window. Results of the check will be shared with parents alongside their end of year report in July.

Lunchtime hall rules

Through our Parent Forum it has come to our attention that some children and parents are unclear about some changes we've made to lunchtime eating in the hall. We have recently introduced a new rule to our eating environment that is that we use indoor, quiet voices whilst we eat. Where children forget this rule, they are always given a verbal reminder first. If they continue to talk very loudly, they will be given 1 minute to sit on a bench in the hall at the end of eating time before they go outside to play. If they continue to talk loudly after this, the minutes add up. The impact we've seen since following this rule has been hugely positive. The hall is now a pleasant environment for the children to eat in whilst still socialising with their peers. To begin with, we had lots of children spending thinking time on the bench, but we now find that there are very few children needing to spend any thinking time there. We've even had days with no one on the bench – the children were all very proud of themselves! Well done everyone!

Please note that we never give a child more minutes than their age (so a 6 year-old would never have more than 6 minutes) and that verbal reminders are always given first. In most cases, the children join their class before they've even finished putting their coats on to go out! They are always supervised by an adult and given the opportunity to talk it through if they wish to. We absolutely do not want children to be sat in silence whilst they eat and see eating time as a social experience, but for the wellbeing of all the children, we needed to make changes to ensure the hall is an enjoyable place to spend time. By using our indoor voices, everyone seems happier and calmer.

We also celebrate those children who are making great lunchtime choices with our usual FLOCK tokens, and our special Hall Hero tokens, to recognise their efforts.
