Who's Who



Allergies

Nightingale Infant and Nursery School takes health care and management of those members of the school community suffering from specific allergies very seriously. We are aware that staff and children who attend may suffer from food, bee/wasp sting, animal or tree-nut allergies and believe that all allergies should be taken seriously and dealt with in a professional and appropriate way.

As part of this strategy, our school is a 'Nut Free School'.

We have children in the school who suffer from nut allergies who can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. The reaction can be caused by not just eating nuts but also being touched on the skin.

We ask that parents and carers ensure that children **DO NOT** have nut products in their lunches for any kind of nut – this includes nuts such as almonds, hazelnuts, cashews, walnuts, brazil nuts, pecans, pistachios and macadamia nuts.

This includes items such as:

Peanut butter sandwiches

Chocolate spread sandwiches

Cereal bars

Some granola bars

Cakes that contain nut-based flours

Peanut butter cakes

Food containing sesame seeds

This list is not exhaustive. Please check the packaging carefully.

Norfolk Model Calendar

This calendar applies to community schools, community special schools, VC schools and nursery schools and sets the days on which school transport will be provided. While most Foundation, VA, foundation special, free schools and academy trusts who are able to set their own dates, adopt the Norfolk Model, we advise you to check with your child's school before making holiday or other commitments.

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Key : White dates - schools open to pupils Yellow dates - pupil holiday Red dates - bank holiday

Five staff training days will be selected from yellow dates, we suggest 2 & 3 September, 25 October, 6 January and 22 April. Some may choose to use twilight hours for staff training instead of some or all of these.
